In the years that followed, Ms. Regalado worked as a commercial litigator at Holland & Knight's Miami office and as an attorney specializing in patent and trademark litigation with the law firm of Malloy & Malloy PA. Currently, she is Of Counsel for the nationwide intellectual property law firm of Feldman Gale, focusing her practice on patent prosecution and commercial litigation.

Ms. Regalado is admitted to practice law in Florida state courts, as well as in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida. She is an active member of several bar associations, including the American Bar Association, the Cuban American Bar Association, and the Intellectual Property Law Association of Florida. She was also an Adjunct Professor of Business Law at Miami Dade College, Wolfson Campus. Ms. Regalado was named a Rising Star in Intellectual Property Litigation by Florida Trend and in 2009, was ranked among the top 40 attorneys in Miami-Dade County under 40 years old by the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation.
