SUBJECT: LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMPREHENSIVE PLAN PROPOSED AND ADOPTED AMENDMENT CONSENT AGENDA

Pursuant to Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, Council review of amendments to local government comprehensive plans is limited to 1) adverse effects on regional resources and facilities identified in the *Strategic Regional Policy Plan for South Florida (SRPP)* and 2) extrajurisdictional impacts that would be inconsistent with the comprehensive plan of any affected local government within the region.

A written report containing an evaluation of these impacts, pursuant to Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, is to be provided to the local government and the State Land Planning Agency within 30 calendar days of receipt of the amendment.

### **DESCRIPTION OF AMENDMENT**

The proposed amendment consists of a text change to the Future Land Use Element. In the Village Building Permit Allocation System (BPAS), the amount of non-residential development allowed is tied to the amount of residential development, which is spread out in annual allocations. Approximately 17,627 non-residential square feet were waived between 2004 and 2009 due to an adopted nonresidential/residential ratio less than that established in the Monroe County Rate of Growth Ordinance.

Existing Policy 1-3.1.1 would be amended to allow a one-time increase of 16,486 square feet of non-residential use in 2012. The proposed amendment would recapture non-residential square footage for new projects. No adverse effects to regional resources and facilities or extrajurisdictional impacts would result from the amendment.

### **DESCRIPTION OF AMENDMENT**

The adopted amendment package contains text amendments to the Future Land Use Element and a map amendment to the Land Use Plan. The map amendment changes the land use designation of approximately 133.57 acres of land from Commercial (122.40 acres) and Recreation and Open Space (3.21 acres) to Local Activity Center (LAC). The text amendment incorporates Policies that define the requirements of the LAC.

The site is generally located north of and adjacent to West Commercial Boulevard between the streets of NW 76<sup>th</sup> Avenue (University Drive) and NW 94<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The intent of the LAC is to facilitate the City's mixed use zoning district, generate economic activity, and accommodate new multi-family housing along Commercial Boulevard.

Minor text changes were made between transmittal and adoption that define residential density bonus allowance for the Local Activity Center through Land Development Regulations and for consistency with the Broward County Land Use Plan.

The County will retain school concurrency, minor statutory revisions to the Public School Facilities Elements would be incorporated. Per the County 2011 EAR, proposed amendments would include Data and Analysis updates and general housekeeping. A new Policy in the Future Unincorporated Area Land Use Element would promote the implementation of the County's Abandoned/Vacant Real Property Registration and Certification Program. No adverse effects to regional resources and facilities or extrajurisdictional impacts would result from the text amendments.
