

# Highlights of Council Activities

December 2009

#### South Florida Regional Planning Council Revolving Loan Fund Marketing Update

The South Florida Regional Planning Council Revolving Loan Programs (SFRPC-RLF, SFRPC-RLF II, RLF III and RESCUE-RLF) are designed to meet the needs of businesses in our Region that are not entirely served by conventional lenders. Funds are available to all small and medium-size businesses within Miami-Dade, Broward and Monroe Counties as well as designated communities within Miami-Dade County. The Revolving Loan Program also provides technical assistance to new and existing borrowers that will assist them with the growth of their business.

The Council has been asked to host the National Football League (NFL) Super Bowl XLIV's Business Leadership Forum. The Forum will be held on February 4, 2010, at the H. Wayne Huizenga School of Business & Entrepreneurship and the Rose & Alfred Miniaci Performing Arts Center. The Business Leadership Forum will include a stimulating panel discussion of current issues facing business owners and a networking event that will promote the exchange of ideas between independent business owners and South Florida's leading corporate procurement personnel.

The South Florida panel will include a diverse group of business leaders including nationally renowned experts in small business, former NFL players turned successful businessmen, and industry leader from within Sprint's Small Business Technology Division. Sprint is the corporate sponsor of the forum along with the NFL.

The next Loan Administration Board meeting is scheduled for December 14, 2009.

#### SR7 Transit Supportive Land Use and Urban Design Assistance

Staff has completed the SR7 Transit Supportive Land Use and Urban Design Assistance Report for the Broward County MPO. This assessment examined land uses, densities and intensities, infrastructure availability, alternative roadway typical section designs, and transit amenities. It supports the work activities in the North University Drive/ State Road 7 Study Area with Broward and Palm Beach County MPOs, FDOT and Florida Atlantic University. #### **Regional Domestic Security Task Force Activities**

The Southeast Regional Domestic Security Task Force (SERDSTF) is one of Florida's seven Regions funded by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to help prevent or respond to terrorism events in the State. The SERDSTF, which is Region 7, includes Monroe, Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach Counties.

Council staff is working with the Communications Work Group of the SERDSTF to update its Tactical Interoperable Communications Plan (TIC Plan) and bring it into compliance with recently released DHS guidelines. It is expected that portions of the updated Plan will be put to the test during an upcoming training exercise to be held January 2010, at Camp Blanding near Jacksonville.

The State of Florida is divided into 11 Local Emergency Planning Committee Districts whose broad duties include preparing regional hazardous materials emergency plans, performing outreach functions to increase awareness and understanding of hazardous substances, and providing free training to public sector hazardous material response employees. Since 1988, the Council has served as staff to the South Florida LEPC District 11 (SoFlaLEPC), which encompasses Miami-Dade, Broward and Monroe Counties.
