SUBJECT: INITIAL CENSUS 2010 SUMMARY

The attached report provides an overview of the first results of the 2010 Census. These results were released in March to support the redistricting process in the states, and include population counts for areas down to the voting district and block level. The profile for Southeast Florida is intended to give an overview of changes over the last decade in the 7-county area that will be the focus of the Sustainable Communities Initiative (for the South Florida and Treasure Coast Regions). There are a series of bullets also to highlight the specific results for South Florida and its counties.

The description of the results is followed by copy of the Council's webpage where we will post 2010 Census data as it becomes available. There you will find a link to 3-page table and graphic profiles for each of the seven counties and their respective municipalities. The profiles present data on the race and ethnic composition of the population in 2000 and 2010, and the change during the decade: for the total population, adults (18 years and over) and children. Profiles are attached to this report for:

- Southeast Florida
- South Florida
- Broward County
- Miami-Dade County
- Monroe County

The final attachment is a table with decennial population counts for the three counties of South Florida and their respective municipalities for 1980 to 2010, along with the percentage change in each decade. Please contact Richard Ogburn (rogburn@sfrpc.com) if you have any questions.

2010 Census Profile for Southeast Florida

Southeast Florida, the region that includes the seven counties from Monroe north to Indian River, added 680,000 new residents between 2000 and 2010, just over 186 per day. This corresponds to an increase of 12.3%, higher than the pace observed in the United States as a whole (9.7%), but lower than the rate of growth for the State of Florida (17.6%).

With 6.2 million residents on Census Day 2010, Southeast Florida is larger than 33 states and the District of Columbia. At the center of the region is the Miami-Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach metropolitan area, the seventh largest in the nation, which reached 5.6 million residents in 2010, an increase of 11.1% over the 2000 total.

Growing ethnic and racial diversity in the region

Southeast Florida experienced dramatic growth of its minority population over the decade. The region's Hispanic or Latino population increased by 37.6%, adding 658,000 residents, compared to 22,000 (0.6%) for the non-Hispanic population. In 2010, Southeast Florida's 2.4 million Hispanic or Latino residents accounted for 38.8% of the total population, up from 31.7% in 2000 and 25.7% in 1990. The Hispanic or Latino population increased in all seven counties, ranging from 20% in Monroe to 192% in St. Lucie.

Southeast Florida's Black or African American population, which includes a significant number of residents originally from Haiti and the English-speaking Caribbean, rose by 218,000 over the decade, an increase of 22.9%. The region in 2010 was home to almost 1.2 million Blacks or African Americans, 18.9% of the total, up from 17.3% in 2000 and 15.7% in 1990.

The White non-Hispanic population in Southeast Florida decreased by almost 229,000 over the 10-year span, from 2.6 million (47.3%) to a little under 2.4 million residents (38.5%). This absolute decline was concentrated in the four counties to the south, where domestic immigration of retirees from elsewhere in the United States in prior decades has been largely replaced by international migration. The three counties to the north all experienced net gains in the White non-Hispanic population, most likely the result of continuing domestic migration.

Aging of the Region

The number of children under the age of 18 increased by 46,000 (3.5%), but decreased as a share of the region's population, from 23.3% in 2000 to 21.5% in 2010. This reflects, in part, the impact of the "echo boom" generation, as the children of baby boomers moved past adolescence into adulthood. There was a net decline of over 104,000 in White non-Hispanic children, offset by an increase of 132,000 Hispanic or Latino children. The number of Black or African American children increased by almost 13,000 (3.9%) over the decade, which was below the pace of overall population growth.

2010 Census Highlights for South Florida

- South Florida's population in 2010 was 4.3 million, led by Miami-Dade County with 2.5 million, Broward with 1.7 million, and Monroe with 73 thousand permanent residents.
- Overall, South Florida added 361,622 new residents, an increase of 9.1%, over the course of the decade, slightly below the national average of 9.7%, but much slower than the 17.6% for the State of Florida as a whole.
- Miami-Dade County led the region (10.8%), followed by Broward County (7.7%); Monroe County was one of two Florida counties that saw a decrease of permanent residents in the last 10 years (6,499, 8.2%).
- Residential vacancy rates reported in the Census in 2010 were notably higher than in 2000, reaching 38.2% in Monroe, 15.3% in Broward and 12.3% in Miami-Dade. Overall in the State of Florida the rate was 17.5%. These compare to vacancy rates of 32.0% for Monroe, 11.7% for Broward, and 8.7% for Miami-Dade in 2000.
- South Florida added over half a million new Hispanic or Latino residents over the last decade, growing more than three times as much as the overall population (31.8%). The Hispanic population increased to over 2 million, which represents 48.1% of the region's total. Miami-Dade led with 65% Hispanic, Broward followed with 25% and Monroe reached 20%.
- South Florida also saw significant growth in the non-Hispanic Black or African American population, increasing from 756,000 to 879,000 (16.3%) - by 2010, more than one in every five residents of the region (20.4%) classified themselves as non-Hispanic Black or African Americans. This racial group includes many Blacks from Haiti and the English-speaking Caribbean, as well as smaller numbers from other parts of the Caribbean and Central and South America.
- By contrast, the region's non-Hispanic White population saw an absolute decline of 140,000 residents (5.9%), and in 2010 represented 27.7% of the total population, down from 37.1% in 2000.
- The number of children (under 18) in South Florida also fell during the decade by almost 8,000, declining from 24.2% to 22.0% of the total.
