Please find attached correspondence from the South Florida Regional Planning Council staff on behalf of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 Collaborative, requesting that the Broward County Planning Council designate a representative and an alternate to participate in scheduled meetings of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 Collaborative Steering Committee. The list of Collaborative/Steering Committee members and the schedule of Steering Committee meetings through the year 2007 is included with the correspondence from the Regional Planning Council staff.

The State Road 7/U.S. 441 Collaborative is a six-year project which is intended to produce a uniform "master plan" that will enhance the viability of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor through innovative land development regulations, mass transit and dense development.

The selection of a Planning Council representative and an alternate to serve on the State Road 7/U.S. 441 Collaborative Steering Committee is the pleasure of the board. However, Broward County Planning Council staff identifies four options, listed below, for the Council's consideration.

- Option 1:* Appoint one Planning Council member as the representative, and one Planning Council member as the alternate.
- Option 2:* Appoint one Planning Council member as the representative, and the Planning Council Executive Director, or designee, as the alternate
- Option 3:* Appoint the Planning Council Executive Director, and/or designees, as the representative and alternate.
- Option 4:* Decline the request.

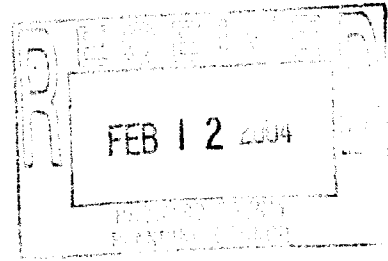
A representative of the South Florida Planning Council staff has been invited to attend the Planning Council's February 26, 2004, meeting.

Dear Ms. Tramer:

I am pleased to inform you that the Steering Committee of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 Collaborative (Collaborative) has requested the Broward County Planning Council's formal participation on the Steering Committee of the Collaborative. The Steering Committee's approved Resolution 04-01 is attached.

As you are aware, the Collaborative contains representation from each jurisdiction along the State Road 7 corridor in Broward County. The Collaborative also contains ex-officio representation from the Florida Department of Transportation, the Florida Department of Community Affairs, the South Florida Water Management District, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization, and the South Florida Regional Planning Council. The South Florida Regional Planning Council also provides administrative support to the Collaborative. The mission of the Collaborative is to work together in promoting the redevelopment of the corridor through a unified and comprehensive planning process.

Through the work of the Collaborative, there are two issues of particular concern that require your agency's input and guidance. One issue is the development of a future land use map category that will support the mix of uses being contemplated in the Strategic Master Plan. The Strategic Master Plan includes a series of design charrettes and associated impact analysis and implementation strategies. The development of the Master Plan began in May of 2003 and will conclude in the Fall of 2005.

The second issue is the need to designate the appropriate amount of future right of way along the corridor through the County's Trafficways Plan to support future long-range transportation needs. It is critically important that sufficient right of way be reserved to support future transportation needs and that any identified surplus right of way be utilized to support transit-oriented redevelopment.


Your staff has already provided valuable assistance to the Collaborative as we strive to comprehensively address these complex redevelopment issues. Your continued assistance will be necessary. We strongly encourage your joining the Collaborative. It is our suggestion that the Broward Planning Council designate a representative to participate in scheduled meetings of the Steering Committee. This assures that a representative of each affected entity will be in attendance at all meetings. The Planning Council's Designated representative may be an elected official or staff member who has access to the Planning Council and can keep them informed. An Alternate representative should also be chosen in the event the official representative is unable to attend. The Alternate should also be someone who has access to the Designee and can keep him/her informed of any meeting work missed.

RESOLUTION 04-01

A RESOLUTION BY THE STEERING COMMITTEE OF THE STATE ROAD 7/U.S. 441 COLLABORATIVE REQUESTING REPRESENTATION FROM THE BROWARD COUNTY PLANNING COUNCIL AS AN EX-OFFICIO STEERING COMMITTEE MEMBER OF THE STATE ROAD 7/U.S. 441 COLLABORATIVE; TO ENCOURAGE THE BROWARD COUNTY PLANNING COUNCIL TO SUPPORT THE ADOPTION OF LOCAL ACTIVITY CENTER OR ALTERNATIVE FUTURE LAND USE CATEGORIES THAT PROMOTE THE UNIFIED REDEVELOPMENT EFFORTS OF EACH LOCAL GOVERNMENT ALONG THE STATE ROAD 7/U.S. 441 CORRIDOR; TO ENCOURAGE THE BROWARD COUNTY PLANNING COUNCIL TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL RESIDENTIAL UNITS TO SUPPORT REDEVELOPMENT; AND TO REQUEST THAT THE BROWARD COUNTY PLANNING COUNCIL CONSIDER SPONSORING ALL LOCAL GOVERNMENT AMENDMENT APPLICATIONS FOR THE STATE ROAD 7 CORRIDOR THAT SEEK LOCAL ACTIVITY CENTER OR ALTERNATIVE FUTURE LAND USE CLASSIFICATION.

Whereas, the Steering Committee of the Collaborative has expressed its desire to create an area-wide comprehensive and functional Master Plan to guide future redevelopment activities along the State Road 7/U.S. 441 Corridor in Broward County; and,

Whereas, the Steering Committee members wish to collaborate with other area local governments to address current land use, transportation, economic and aesthetic issues along the State Road 7/U.S. 441 Corridor and increase intergovernmental cooperation; and,

Whereas, the Steering Committee includes representation from each corridor jurisdiction, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization; the Florida Department of Transportation; and the South Florida Regional Planning Council; and,

Whereas, the Steering Committee conducts quarterly meetings to discuss and conduct business; and

Whereas, the Steering Committee of the Collaborative has established a Land Use Subcommittee to address the need to appropriately establish a Future Land Use Map category that is supportive of redevelopment of the *State Road 7 Strategic Master Plan*; and,

Whereas, the Broward County Planning Council provides oversight and technical assistance for Future Land Use Map designations for all jurisdictions in Broward County; and,

Whereas, member jurisdictions of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 Collaborative have or will be in position to submit formal future land use map amendment applications to the Broward County Planning Council to designate portions of State Road 7 as Local Activity Centers; and,

Whereas, the State Road 7 Strategic Master Plan will be functionally completed by 2005 and each State Road 7/U.S. 441 Collaborative jurisdiction will be in position to submit formal future land use map amendment applications to the Broward County Planning Council by 2005; and,

Whereas, Broward County staff has proposed to adopt as part of its Evaluation and Appraisal Report (EAR) a new Future Land Use Category that would support additional vertically integrated mixed-use redevelopment along urban corridors, such as, the State Road 7 Corridor; and,


Whereas, currently there is limited availability of flex units along the corridor that may be needed to support redevelopment, premium transit modes, and future population growth within Broward County; and,

Whereas, the current fee for a local government for a land use amendment application submitted to the Broward County Planning Council is approximately \$6,800; and,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by the Steering Committee of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 Collaborative that:

1. The Broward County Planning Council consider appointing a representative to serve as an Ex-Officio member of the Steering Committee of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 Collaborative to provide technical assistance and input on matters of concern; and,
2. The Broward County Planning Council give favorable consideration to each Future Land Use Map application for Local Activity Center designation along the State Road 7 corridor submitted by member jurisdictions; and,
3. The Broward County Planning Council give favorable consideration for the increase in residential units that may be necessary to promote redevelopment of the corridor; and,
4. The Broward County Planning Council consider an exemption of fees for each municipally sponsored future land use amendment submitted for the purposes of implementing the *State Road 7 Strategic Master Plan*.

I. Purpose

The Purpose of this Partnership is to provide a framework to support the signatory agencies, organizations and governments, within Broward, Miami-Dade, and Palm Beach Counties to work in coordination to facilitate the aesthetic and economic revitalization of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor. This document is not intended to be a contract. It is recognized that party has different interests, priorities, and responsibilities. However, this document shall signify the cooperative intent of the parties.

II. Agreement

WHEREAS, the signatory agencies, organizations and governments whom execute this agreement will be collectively referred to as signatories; and,

WHEREAS, jurisdictions along the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor have expressed their desire to enter into and participate in a cooperative undertaking to further facilitate ongoing areawide comprehensive, functional and best-planning practice activities along the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor; and,

WHEREAS, the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor is a heavily traveled corridor extending from Palm Beach County in the north, through Broward County, to Miami-Dade County in the south; and,

WHEREAS, each of the signatories to this agreement bears responsibility for or involvement in some aspect of redevelopment activities along the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor; and,

WHEREAS, each of the signatories to this agreement understands that revitalization of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor will generate social, economic, and environmental benefits to the region; and,

WHEREAS, each of the signatories to this agreement is committed to the following guiding principles related to revitalization of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor:

- Coordinating the implementation of existing statutes, ordinances, regulations, applicable programs, and other efforts that will assist with local revitalization measures and maximize their efficiency and effectiveness and thereby reduce the need for state review of amendments to local government comprehensive plans;
- Approaching revitalization of State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor in the context of broader economic development, neighborhood development, and urban revitalization efforts;

- Recognizing that the economic development, efficient and practical transportation systems, and community land use at appropriate densities and intensities are linked and should be thoughtfully planned;
- Providing a good quality of life for citizens working or living adjacent to the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor includes the need to provide adequate infrastructure and facilities to support the development of livable communities; and,
- Collectively implementing participatory solutions involving residents and businesses of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor;

WHEREAS, there is a need to address current land use/transportation issues along the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor and increase effective intergovernmental cooperation; and,

WHEREAS, the participation and involvement of area local governments, stakeholders, and agencies is critical to the future regional mobility, enhanced quality of life for area residents, and effective extrajurisdictional coordination of impacts; and,

WHEREAS, the problems of growth and development often transcend the boundaries of individual units of local general-purpose government, and often no single unit can formulate plans or implement policies for their solution without affecting other units in their geographic area; and,

WHEREAS, the regional planning council is recognized as Florida's only multipurpose regional entity that is in a position to plan for and coordinate intergovernmental solutions to growth-related problems on greater-than-local issues, provide technical assistance to local governments, and meet other needs of the communities in each region; and,

WHEREAS, there is a need for the South Florida Regional Planning Council (SFRPC) to assist local governments to resolve their common problems, engage in areawide comprehensive and functional planning, administer certain federal and state grants-in-aid, and provide a regional focus in regard to multiple programs undertaken on an areawide basis; and,

WHEREAS, the SFRPC shall assist local governments with activities designed to promote and facilitate economic development in the geographic area covered by the council; and,

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this agreement to facilitate community involvement in the planning of future transportation alternatives to support local development opportunities, promote residential infill, further employment opportunities, reduce urban sprawl pressures, foster increased intergovernmental coordination, and coordinate supporting infrastructure improvements; and,

WHEREAS, this agreement shall serve as a commitment of cooperation, realizing the mutual benefit to be derived from a close working relationship and shall be reviewed and amended as necessary; and,

WHEREAS, it is not the intent of this agreement to specify all areas that can or should be effectively coordinated.

NOW, THEREFORE, this agreement is established to create a framework for coordinating efforts and extrajurisdictional impacts relating to the revitalization of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor.

Focus of Cooperative Activities

The signatories to this agreement share mutual interest in the following issues and will use this agreement to expand their cooperation to:

1. Establish a State Road 7/U.S. 441 Partnership Policy Committee. This shall be an advisory committee which will from time to time issue recommendations to the signatories concerning State Road 7/U.S. 441 matters and concerns. The Policy Committee will be subject to the Public Records and Sunshine Laws of Florida.
2. Complete a Strategic Plan identifying and describing tasks to be undertaken by the Partnership within the first year of this agreement taking effect, and to complete subsequent workplans for future periods, as appropriate, for the life of this agreement.
3. Complete an inventory of existing planning and implementation efforts along the State Road 7/U.S. 441 Corridor. The results of this inventory will provide a basis to coordinate consistency between efforts and identify strategies for their successful implementation.
4. Undertake an Initiative to create a collective vision for the urban design of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor that shall apply in each jurisdiction to the extent that each jurisdiction chooses to make them applicable to foster individual community identity, create a sense of place, and promote pedestrian-oriented safe neighborhoods and town centers.
5. Undertake a review of local comprehensive plans, land development regulations, and capital improvement programs to help ensure that these instruments will move the community toward its vision.
6. Cooperate to submit competitive applications for enhanced State, Federal or other grant funding and assistance to support the activities of the State Road 7/U.S. 441 Partnership.
7. Will work together in support of comprehensive and inclusive sustainable development practices throughout the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor.
8. Will coordinate with the SFRPC and other SR 7/U.S. 441 Partnership signatory entities in its development and implementation of local planning and implementation activities.
9. Will collaborate with and encourage the coordination of current projects and planning efforts along the corridor including, but not limited to, Transportation and Transit, Land Use, Economic Development, Aesthetics, Intergovernmental Coordination, and Plan Implementation along the State Road 7/U.S. 441 corridor.
10. Will cultivate a link between redevelopment and access and expansion of public transit systems and include enhancing the accessibility of the finished project by multiple transportation modes.
11. Will support redevelopment activities that are consistent with such urban infill and redevelopment principles as infill development at appropriate densities and intensities, good urban design, pedestrian and transit oriented design, crime prevention through design, urban greenways and public open spaces, mixed use, and mixed income development.
12. Actively seek the involvement of the wide range and diversity of stakeholders in public participation in the planning and implementation of specific projects.

III. Programming, Budgeting, Funding and Reimbursement

1. This agreement is neither a fiscal nor a funding obligation. Any transfer of funds between signatories may take place through applicable laws, agreements, existing authorities and procedures.
2. Nothing in this agreement shall obligate the signatories to expend appropriations, obligate funds or enter into any contract or agreement.
